Toy car




Focus 2: Multi-sensory prompts: White paper, paint, tissue paper,

- Make a book or Our Story about how child likes to play with her friends using photographs. Use on sight word vocabulary to make a simple repeating story if appropriate e.g. "We play"

Maths activities:


- Take photographs of lion hidden in different places and use positional language to describe.
- Follow adult's instructions using positional language for where to hide the lion toy.



- Teach the hide a lion game to a peer or small group of peers.
- Go outside on a cloudy day, lie down and look at the clouds. Can you see any shapes?
- Explore a range of lion stories:
